3. USSR: ETHNIC CONFLICT ERUPTS IN GEORGIAN REPUBLIC

MORE THAN 100,000 PROTESTERS, MANY REPORTEDLY CALLING FOR GEORGIAN INDEPENDENCE. THE PROTESTS HAD APPARENTLY STARTED ON TUESDAY IN REACTION TO DEMANDS LAST MONTH BY ABKHAZIANS FOR THE SECESSION OF THEIR AUTONOMOUS REPUBLIC (ASSR) FROM GEORGIA AND TO AN INCIDENT IN WHICH ABKHAZIANS FIRED ON GEORGIANS AT A RALLY AT LESELIDZE. THE GEORGIAN SUPREME SOVIET ON 31 MARCH REJECTED THE ABKHAZIAN PETITION FOR DIRECT RULE OF THE ASSR BY MOSCOW LIKE THAT WORKED OUT FOR NAGORNO-KARABAKH. SOVIET MEDIA REPORTED THAT THE ABKHAZIAN PARTY CHIEF, WHO WAS RECENTLY ELECTED TO THE NEW CONGRESS OF PEOPLE'S DEPUTIES. WAS DISMISSED BY GEORGIAN PARTY LEADERS ON THURSDAY.

COMMENT: GEORGIAN NATIONALISTS HAVE BEEN EMBOLDENED BY THE ASSERTIVENESS OF THE OTHER NATIONALITIES IN THE CAUCASUS. CALLS FOR GEORGIAN INDEPENDENCE PROBABLY BEGAN WITH A SMALL GROUP OF RADICALS BUT MAY SPREAD IF PROTESTERS GAIN CONFIDENCE. THE REPUBLIC GOVERNMENT IS LIKELY TO BEGIN ARRESTING PROTESTERS IN AN ATTEMPT TO RESTORE CALM, EVEN THOUGH A SHOW OF FORCE MAY SPARK CLASHES AS IT DID IN ARMENIA AND AZERBAIJAN LAST WINTER. THE ABKHAZIANS' ACTIONS ARE CONFIRMING THE FEARS OF SOME SOVIET LEADERS THAT THE NAGORNO-KARABAKH PRECEDENT WILL ENCOURAGE OTHER MINORITIES TO DEMAND GREATER AUTONOMY.
