THE DECREE AMENDING THE LAW ON STATE CRIMES PASSED ON SATURDAY BY THE SUPREME SOVIET PRESIDIUM APPEARS AIMED AT INCREASING RATHER THAN RESTRICTING CONTROLS AND IS A BLOW TO REFORMERS. ALTHOUGH SOVIET OFFICIALS INDICATED FOR THIS YEAR AND	E

EMERGING, THE PRECISE TIMING OF THE PRESIDIUM ACTION WAS UNDOUBTEDLY RELATED TO THE OUTBREAK OF NATIONALIST UNREST IN GEORGIA. THE CHANGES STRENGTHEN EXISTING PROHIBITIONS AGAINST AROUSING INTERETHNIC OR RACIAL HOSTILITY AND AGAINST PARTICIPATING IN ANTI-SOVIET AGITATION, SLANDER, OR PROPAGANDA.

THE AMENDED LAW INCREASES THE REGIME'S FLEXIBILITY TO IMPOSE VARIED PENALTIES FOR CRIMES INVOLVING ETHNIC STRIFE AND IMPOSES STRICTER PUNISHMENT WHEN SUCH ACTIONS ARE COMBINED WITH VIOLENCE OR THREATS. ACTIONS COMMITTED BY A GROUP OR ENDING IN LOSS OF LIFE CARRY UP TO 10 YEARS' IMPRISONMENT.

THE AMENDMENTS ALSO MAINTAIN THE STATE'S SWEEPING POWER TO SILENCE DISSIDENTS, WHISTLE-BLOWERS, AND INVESTIGATIVE REPORTERS. RATHER THAN ACCEPTING PROPOSALS TO LIBERALIZE CRIMINAL LAW AND FREEDOM OF EXPRESSION, THE REGIME HAS TIGHTENED LIMITS:

X--BROAD RESTRICTIONS AGAINST ANTI-SOVIET AGITATION CONTINUE.

ANY PUBLIC APPEAL FOR UNDERMINING OR OVERTHROWING THE SOVIET STATE

AND SOCIAL SYSTEM IS PUNISHABLE BY IMPRISONMENT UP TO THREE YEARS OR
FINES UP TO 2,000 RUBLES.

X--SUCH ACTIVITIES, IF COMMITTED BY AN ORGANIZED GROUP OR BY USING COPYING MACHINES, CARRY PRISON TERMS OF AS LONG AS SEVEN YEARS OR FINES UP TO 5.000 RUBLES. IN A NEW TWIST, ACTIONS COMMITTED ON THE INSTRUCTION OF FOREIGN GROUPS ARE PUNISHABLE BY IMPRISONMENT OF THREE TO 10 YEARS.

X--ANTI-SOVIET SLANDER IS STILL ILLEGAL, DESPITE EARLIER PROMISES TO ELIMINATE OR RESTRICT THIS PROVISION TO FURTHER GLASNOST. THE LAW SPECIFICALLY PROMIBITS PUBLIC INSULTS OR DISCREDITING OF GOVERNMENT BODIES OR OFFICIALS. THE NEW PROVISIONS APPARENTLY NO LONGER REQUIRE THAT INTENT TO DISCREDIT THE STATE BE PRESENT OR THAT THE INFORMATION BE FALSE.


